About Station

The Central Training Institute was established at Mannuthy in 1986 with its sub-unit at Vellayani as a special sub-project under National Agricultural Extension Project (NAEP). Over the years CTI has moved from being dependent on Plan funds to make training a revenue generating activity of the University. It has progressively improved its training delivery skills and effectiveness and ventured out to be a training provider for national and international clientele

Achievements

- Sponsored Training: where the Course Fee is borne by the Sponsoring Agency
- Vocational Training: Where the individual trainee pays the Course Fee
- Stipendiary Training: A stipend is paid to the trainees from KAU funds as KAU stands to benefit from the sale of the products of the training
- Agri Clinics and Agri Business Training in collaboration with MANAGE, Hyderabad to encourage entrepreneurship in agricultural graduates
- National Training Programmes done in line with GOI norms
- International Training programmes based on demand

Revenue Generation:

Vocational or Sponsored Training Programmes: Anticipated Actual Expenditure + 20 Institutional Overheads, thus ensuring a 20% front end revenue over and above stationery and maintenance expenses. In International Training Programmes, the course fee is US \$ 250 per participant per day with 20% Institutional Overheads which goes as revenue to the University and another 10% is used for infrastructural development of the concerned station.

These varieties have been recommended for cultivation in the riverine alluvium of south Kerala. However they are widely cultivated through out Kerala.
